To help your child prepare:

1. Encourage daily short practice for fluency.
2. Add simple and relevant actions (folded hands for "Namaste," flying hands for birds, etc.).
3. Use small props (flower, toy, or cut-out). This helps them to remember which rhymes they have prepared instead of getting influenced with their peers.
4. Practise expressions — smiles, eye contact, and confidence.
5. Give chances for independent practice in front of the mirror to build stage confidence.

With these small efforts, children will not only remember their rhymes better but also perform with joy, discipline and confidence on stage.

11. Interesting Insect Day:- 28th November'25 (Friday)

Rhymes and Theme of the month: -

Videos of all the rhymes and themes from the rhyme book are shared weekly. Please ensure your child practices the rhymes during the same week. This regular practice will help them prepare automatically for competition time at the end of the month, ensuring they are ready and confident.

WORD BANK: - The parents are requested to incorporate the given words in their conversation with the child in the daily life situation as the reinforcement for the newly introduced words:-

Insects – crawls, cockroach, ladybird, ant, earthworm, snail, spider, eight legs, flies, mosquito, butterfly, bee, tiny creatures, six legs, web, bites, malaria, poisonous, silk, red spot, stings, colourful, honey

Banana Tree – big leaves, worship, sacred tree, wrapping

Marigold – orange, yellow, small and many petals, strong fragrance, garland

Heavy things – stones, brick, coin, nail, bar of soap, sink.

Light things – log, feather, leaf, float

Pomegranate – hard shell, many seeds

Orange – pumpkin, carrot, masoor dal, orange (fruit), ice-cream

Diwali – Goddess Lakshmi, decorate, light, diya, candle, rangoli, fire crackers, sweets, gifts

Jawaharlal Nehru – rose, white cap, Chacha Nehru, birthday, children day, 14th November

Places of worship – church, christians, temple, hindus, mosque, muslims, gurudwara, Sikhs

l – lamp, lotus, ladybug, lion, lamb, ladder, leaf, lock, lip, log, leg

Handy Tips

Insects

1. Take your child to the garden/park and show them the colourful butterflies, ladybirds, grasshoppers etc.
2. Point out the common insects that your child comes across in his daily life, like fly, ant, cockroach etc.
3. Talk about some harmful insects and how they can spread diseases.
4. Show them places from where they emerge, e.g. Drain, holes of kitchen or bathroom.
5. When your child is having honey, tell him/her that the honey bee makes honey.
6. Show them ants walking in a line.

It is compulsory to pin up school badge and napkin on your child's shirt (it could be pinned up from the back side). We expect parent's full co-operation in this regard to maintain proper hygiene in the school.
