Theme for the month: - Water Animals

Shape – Star **Fruit** – Orange

4. Rhymes and Carol Competition: 17th December'25 (Wednesday)

For the upcoming Rhymes Contest, children will be judged with greater weightage on actions and expressions along with clear recitation. As children enjoy doing actions in class, they know it all. With your guidance at home, they can learn to channel actions meaningfully into their performance.

To help your child prepare:

- 1. Encourage daily short practice for fluency.
- 2. Add simple and relevant actions (folded hands for "Namaste," flying hands for birds, etc.).
- 3. Use small props (flower, toy, or cut-out). This helps them to remember which rhymes they have
- 4. prepared instead of getting influenced with their peers.
- 5. Practise expressions smiles, eye contact, and confidence.
- 6. Give chances for independent practice in front of the mirror to build stage confidence. With these small efforts, children will not only remember their rhymes better but also perform with joy, discipline and confidence on stage.

This is Christmas time and let kids sing some carols for Lord Jesus and get into the vibes of Christmas. So this month we have carol competition instead of shlokas. The name and link of carols are provided, practice and enjoy.

5. <u>Puzzle Contest</u>:- 18th December'25 (Thursday)

Piece by piece, fit them right—

6. <u>Into the Sea Day</u>:- 19th December'25 (Friday)

The fish in the sea go swim, swim, swim,

Kids are going to dress up as sea animal of their choice and will do fun activities along with learning about them.

8. <u>Christmas Carnival</u>: - 23rd December'25 (Tuesday)

Rhymes and Theme of the month: -

Videos of all the rhymes and themes from the rhyme book are shared weekly. Please ensure your child practices the rhymes during the same week. This regular practice will help them prepare automatically for competition time at the end of the month, ensuring they are ready and confident.

Word Bank: -The parents are requested to incorporate the given words in their conversation with the child in the daily life situation as the reinforcement for the newly introduced words.

<u>WATERANIMALS</u>- frog, pond, crocodile, octopus, eight legs, dolphin, whale, biggest water animal, jellyfish, seahorse, tortoise, crab, starfish, fish, eyes, gills, fins, tail.

ORANGE- orange colour, few seeds, juice, drink.

PINK - red and white, pig, lotus, bougainvillea, onion, flamingo.

<u>DIFFERENT TIMES OF A DAY-</u> morning, afternoon, evening, night.

WINTER SEASON: - cold, sweater, jacket, muffler, socks, cap, hot soup, milk.

<u>CHRISTMAS</u>: - Birthday, Lord Jesus, Christmas, church, decorate, Christmas tree, cone shaped, Santa Claus, Cathedral.

Handy Tips: -

- 1. Take your child for a visit and show him/her the different animals.
- 2. Cutout and save a variety of animal pictures. Help the child to stick them in a book. Talk about the animals he/she had seen.
- 3. You can also help them to classify animals into (a) Land animals and (b) Water animals.
- 4. Take a chart paper and divide it into two halves. On the 1st half your child to stick pictures of small animals like dog, cat, rat etc and on the other half stick pictures of big animals like elephant, whale etc.
- 5. Its winter time, take your ward for picnic.
- 6. Make a snowman (with cotton wool) with your child.
- 7. Collect pictures of things that we eat, drink and wear in winter. Help your child stick all the picture sonar large chart paper titled "Winter Time". Put up the chart in your child's room.
- 8. Take your child to vegetable and fruit market and point out all the winter fruits and vegetables.
- 9. Help your child to decorate Christmas tree with stars, bells and confetti etc.
- 10. Tell your child the story about the birth of Jesus Christ.

HANDS - ON AQUARIUM:

Watching fish in an aquarium is very relaxing for all ages! Take your child to an aquarium or a pet shop to take a look at real under water creatures. Encourage him/her to talk about the different types of underwater creatures as wells their colours.

LITTLE TURTLE:

A simple finger play about turtles and their shells emphasizes their hiding nature which fascinates children. Hold one hand in a fist, with the thumb tucked in. Tell your child that it is a pretend turtle. Encourage him/her to make a turtle too. Chant the following verse:-

- *'Little turtle come out to play......don't stay in your house all day.'
- *Rub the top of your fist with the other hand in a circular motion to get the turtle to come out to play. Next pop your thumb out like the head of a turtle.
- *Pretend to feed it and let the little turtle (thumb) give your child a little kiss on the cheek.
- *Have the little turtle go back home with the following verse:-
- *Little turtle go back inside, that's where you like to hide!
