**Theme for the Month:** - **Animals**

**Shape** – Circle, Trapezium      **Colour** – Yellow  
**Fruit** – Watermelon              **Concept** – Big & Small  
**Flower** – Sunflower              **Sound** – j, k, t, w, z  
**Tree** – Mango Tree

Children are encouraged to wear **YELLOW** attire on all Wednesdays of these months and collect the same colour objects from the surroundings.

**Informal Conversation:** - summer season, sun, moon, Name of the mother, father and school.

**Shloka of the month:** - रामरामेतिरामेति, रमेरामेमनोरमे ।

**Meaning:** - To Chant **Shri Ram RamRaameti** once is equal to chanting the name of Rama a thousand times.  
This mantra is known as the Taraka Mantra.

**14. Rhymes and Shlok Competition:- 29<sup>th</sup> June'26 (Monday)**

Rhymes and shlokas are regularly practiced in class, but reinforcing them at home helps ensure perfect pronunciation. While rhymes are generally easier to learn and remember than shlokas, we recommend starting with the first line of the shloka, mastering it, and then gradually moving to the next.

**Here are some key points to help your ward prepare for a rhymes and shlok competition:**

**1. Practice and Repetition**

Practice daily in short sessions to avoid fatigue.  
Use actions and gestures to make learning engaging and memorable.

**2. Pronunciation and Clarity**

Emphasize clear pronunciation of words and correct intonation.  
Break down difficult phrases and practice them separately.

**3. Expression and Voice Modulation**

Teach to use facial expressions and modulate their voice to convey emotions.  
Encourage a cheerful and confident tone.

**4. Memorization Techniques**

Use repetition, storytelling, or visual aids to help memorize the content.  
Practice in smaller parts, then combine them gradually.

**5. Presentation Skills**

Teach to maintain eye contact with the audience.  
Ensure proper posture, gestures, and a warm smile during the performance.

**6. Dress and Props**

Use appropriate props to complement the rhyme or shlok.  
Keep it simple and child-friendly to avoid discomfort.

## 7. Mock Practice

Conduct mock performances at home with family as an audience.

Use a microphone (if applicable) to build familiarity with competition settings.

## 8. Positive Reinforcement

Encourage and praise their efforts, regardless of the outcome.

Ensure the child is well-rested and arrives on time. Pack all necessary props, if there is any.

**These steps will help the child feel confident and perform their best!**

### Rhymes and Theme of the month: -

Videos of all the rhymes and themes from the rhyme book are shared weekly. Please ensure your child practices the rhymes during the same week. This regular practice will help them prepare automatically for competition time at the end of the month, ensuring they are ready and confident.

Word Bank: - The parents are requested to incorporate the given words in their conversation with the child in the daily life situation as the reinforcement for the newly introduced words:-

Wild Animals: - Forest, dangerous, afraid, lion, king, meat, tiger, cub, large cat, elephant, biggest, deer, runs fast, sugarcane, bear, thick, fur, honey, zebra, black and white stripes, fox, cunning, animal, cheetah, fastest running animal, kangaroo, joey, pouch, jumps, hops, hippopotamus, thick skin, lives in water.

Domestic Animals: - Dog, puppy, kennel, barks, bone, cat, kitten, basket, mews, milk, cow, calf, shed, moos, grass, horse, foal, stable, neighs, gram, gallops, pig, piglet, sty, garbage, goat, kid, pen, sheep, lamb, rabbit, bunny, burrow, carrot

Useful Animals: - Cow, dog, guards, horse, donkey, camel, elephant, carry load, ox, ploughs field.

Yellow: - Sun, sunflower, lemon, giraffe, cheetah, chick, banana, primary colour.

Watermelon: - Green, outside, red, inside, many seeds.

Mango: - Summer fruit, king of fruits, one big seed, pulp, juice, pickle, raw mango, green and sour, ripe mango, yellow and sweet.

Indoor Games: - Ludo, chess, carom board, boxing, table tennis.

Outdoor Games: - Cricket, hockey, football, basketball, lawn tennis.

Solar System: - Sun, eight planets, moves, around fixed path orbit, mars, Venus, Jupiter, Mercury, Saturn, Earth, Uranus, Neptune.

**j** – jam, joker, jug, jelly, jacket, jigsaw, jar, jackal, juice, jupiter, jack fruit, jeans, jungle,

**k** - kite, key, kettle, kangaroo, king, kitchen, kid, kitten, kennel

#### **For Animals**

1. Take your child for a visit to the Zoo (whenever you are visiting other towns) and show him/her the different animals.
2. Cut out and save a variety of animal pictures. Help the child to stick them in a book. Talk about the animals he/she had seen at the Zoo, on the road or at any other place.
3. Cut and save a variety of animal pictures. Help the child to sort them into wild, pet and domestic animals.
4. You can also help them to classify animals into (a) Land animals and (b) Water animals

He started gnawing the ropes with his sharp teeth.

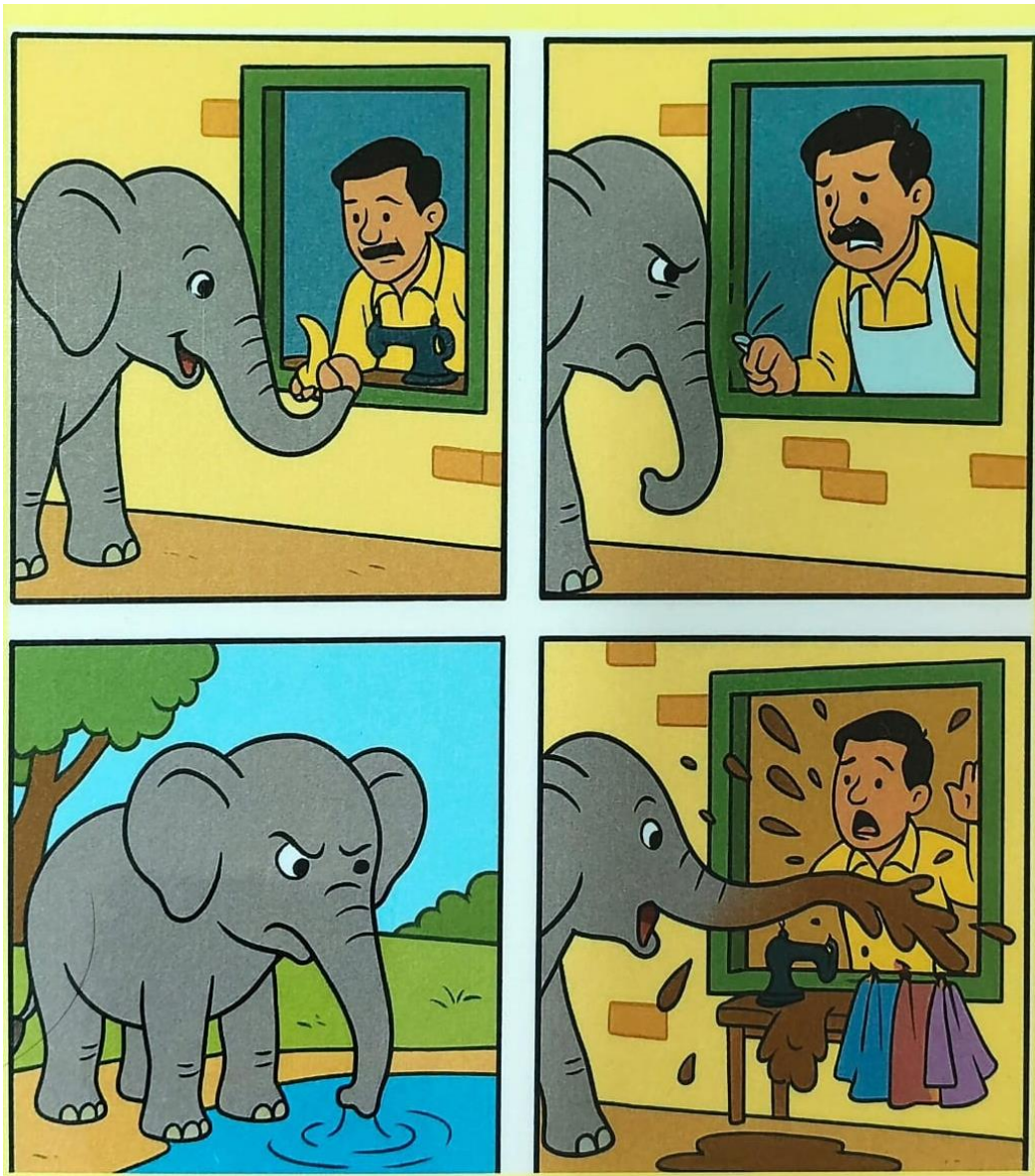
Soon, the net broke and the lion was free!
